

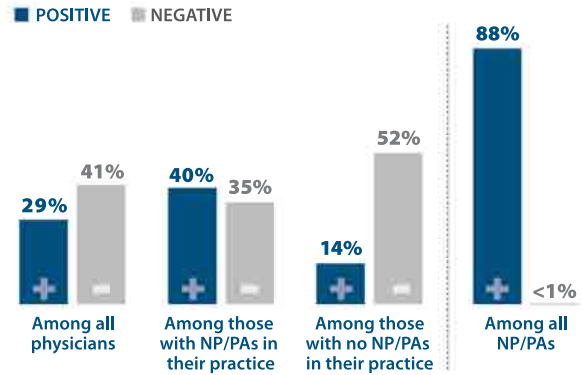

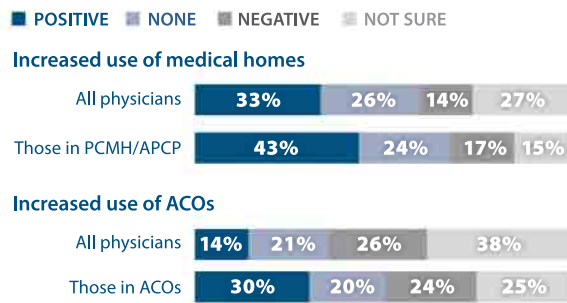

Qualifying as a patient-centered medical home (PCMH) or advanced primary care practice (APCP)			30%

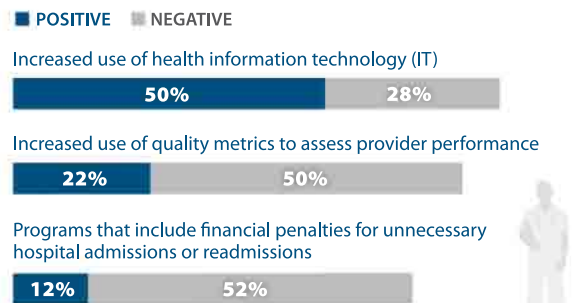

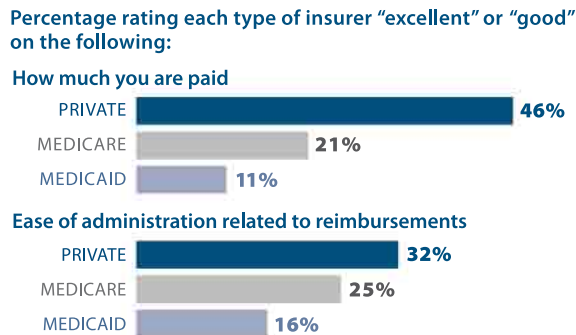
**Physician Views on Effect of Accountable Care Organizations and Medical Homes on Overall Quality of Care Are Mixed**



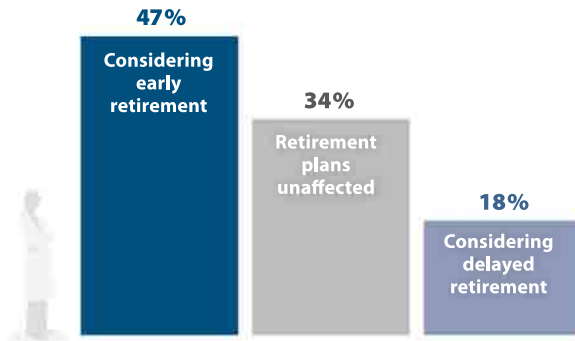
**Physicians See Effect of Health IT as Positive, Quality Metrics and Financial Penalties as Negative, for Overall Quality of Care**
