Qualifications:

- Doctor of Pharmacy degree
- Completion of a PGY1 residency
- Must be eligible for licensure in Colorado

The National Matching Service (NMS) program code is 514465. **The application deadline is January 3, 2014.** Interested applicants must submit a letter of intent (explain why an ambulatory care residency is desired, how our program will help achieve your career goals, and how you can contribute to our program), curriculum vitae, academic transcripts, and three letters of reference using the ASHP **PhORCAS** web-based application system.

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Appointment to this program is contingent upon the resident satisfying the following requirements: obtaining Colorado pharmacist's license prior to the start of the residency and passing a background check.

Upon completion of this residency, the graduate will be prepared to practice as a clinical pharmacy specialist across a variety of ambulatory care settings.
